1. Opening remarks

2. Address by the Principal: Mr. J. Fogarty

Thank you to everyone for attending the AGM. Thank you to the PA committee for their volunteer time and effort.

Status of the school:

- The school is in a good place at present, and in a good position financially. The recent building works are also finished and the basketball court is now open.
- There were 42 Junior infants accepted into the school this year.
- The school has a mission statement. However, the teachers and board of management of the school came together to develop a vision statement which highlights the school's catholic ethos, as well as the safe and secure environment to nurture our children.
- Mr Fogarty reminded the parents that while learning is a shared enterprise between children, parents and teachers, the school continues to support the children to help themselves learn. He also recognised the broad intelligence spectrum that makes up all humans, and reassured parents that the school will continue to support the children to develop all the aspects of their strengths including in sports, music, academia and otherwise.
- He encouraged the wider community around the school to continue to give back/contribute to our community.
- Mr Fogarty noted that multigrade classes are here to stay, and will be a feature of the school going forward. All reports show that the multigrade classes have been working well and appear to be well accepted and liked by both teachers and children alike.
- The current Board of Management will be stepping down in October and a new board of management will be elected. There will be elections of two parent nominees - one mother and one father. The board of management parent nominees once elected will sit on the BoM and will be duty bound to that board.

Ms. Doyle - Retirement:

 Ms. M. Doyle is due to retire. Principal J.F. requested a parent to say a few words at her retirement celebration, and also requested the PA to give a token of appreciation on behalf of the parents. We are thankful to Claire Kelly who gave a wonderful speech to thank Mrs Doyle, and a token of appreciation was presented to Mrs Doyle during the mass.

Parent Teacher meetings

 Parent teacher meetings will now be booked online via Aladdin. The first slots released will be for parents who have more than one child in the school. The next wave of slots will then be released.

Child protection review:

• Child protection policies and risk assessments related to children attending the school are now complete.

Neurodiversity group:

Work has been completed in conjunction with the neurodiversity subcommittee to produce a one-page information leaflet - to help parents understand the national psychological assessment process when assessing neurodiversity. This is currently a draft information leaflet, and work on it continues.

Events:

The various social events during the year will aim to enhance the school within the local community. Grandparents' day, Sacrament Day are all part of that tradition. The school hopes to continue with these events in the calendar.

Fundraising:

The school would like to prioritise the various targets that it would like to fundraise for. For example, the PA has traditionally given money towards music generation running in the school each year.

Mr Fogarty requested the PA to prioritise procurement of soccer jerseys for some of the boys' and girls' teams during the year.

3. PA financial Report 2022/2023

- The PA raised €12,000 total during the 2022/2023 academic year. €10,500 was raised directly by the PA, and €1,500 was donated by the Warriors Committee to the school.
- Music generation was supported last year by the PA. €1,000 was contributed toward it from PA funds.
- Expenditure this year has included bank fees, tea/coffee, biscuits, etc:
- The PA has secured its own SUM UP for contactless donations.
- The PA does not hold large sums of money in its bank account. All sums raised (for a specified purpose) are transferred to the school in a timely manner.
- Currently there is: €159.00 in the bank account.
- The PA would like to express gratitude to all the parents who donated to the PA fundraising causes last year.

4. What is the PA? How it works:

- The PA is everyone who is a parent in the school, and should have between 5 to 9 committee members, including a Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, Communications officer etc.
- It relies on open communication, and has an AGMevery September
- There are approximately 3 committee meetings per academic year.
- The PA is supported by various sub committees. Each of these sub committees has an area of focus. Some may be temporal and formed as needed for a specific event. Some may have a longer-term focus. The idea of the subcommittees is that people can get involved in an area of interest to them.

5. PA Constitution:

- The PA constitution was presented and adopted as the guiding document for the Strandhill School PA. It is available on the PA page of the school website
- It was highlighted that the constitution is a live/working document. The idea is to keep modifying it and progressing it forward as needed to respond to change in our school and its environment.
- The constitution can be amended by vote at an AGM or EGM.

- a. The PA would like to see if a school policy on homework can be developed as it is unclear at the moment.
- b. The intention is to survey the parents, teachers and students to get input into the school's homework policy.

2. Neurodiversity

- a. This arose from an identified parental need
- b. To provide information and support to all parents
- c. Examples of focus include development of a sensory garden within the school grounds for all children to access
- d. The subcommittee holds information nights / events for all people who would like to attend.
- e. It also helps the school focus on areas of improvement / lends support for the child's journey through the school.
